As a valued supporter of The Christie Charity, we want to let you know about some recent changes we have made. These changes are purely administrative and mean we are now a self-governing charity, managing our own governance arrangements, including the appointment of independent trustees.

The Christie Charity will continue to solely support The Christie NHS Foundation Trust and its cancer patients providing enhanced services over and above what the NHS is able to fund.

We really value everything that our supporters do for us and in return we want to assure you that we are spending your donations as cost effectively as possible, with 82p of every £1 raised going directly to our cancer patients – an investment we are really proud of, and which ensures we are doing all we can to support patients and their families.

The good news is that you need take no action. Please be assured this change will not affect the service you receive in any way. The only change you will notice is that with effect from 8th February 2024, when we collect your Direct Debits, instead of RSM 2000 Ltd Re Christie Hospital, our name, RSM 2000 Re Christie Charity will appear on your bank/ building society statement.

There is no need for you to complete a new Direct Debit Instruction, as details of the change will have been supplied to your bank, who may also notify you, independently. You may also see a comment on your bank statement advising you of the final payment under the old name details and the first payment under the new name / details.

The monies collected by Direct Debit will continue to be credited to RSM 2000 Ltd Re Christie Charity and you will continue to enjoy the benefits of the Direct Debit Guarantee, as detailed overleaf.
